## NATIONAL SANCTITY OF HUMAN LIFE SUNDAY

"So God created mankind in his own image, in the image of God he created them... Genesis 1:27

We are created in the image of God. While we may not understand the full implications of this statement, we can be sure that it assigns us immeasurable worth and significance in the sight of God. As Christians we are called to esteem human life as sacred, precious and a mysterious reflection of the Godhead. We are also called to defend, protect and value all human life, whether it be an unborn child, the elderly or infirmed, or the physically or mentally challenged.

This Sunday we commemorate National Sanctity of Human Life Day. This day was established in 1984 to be the third Sunday in January, which is the closest Sunday to the anniversary of the January 22, 1973 Roe vs. Wade Supreme Court decision to legalize abortion. Since that historic decision, more



than 55 million abortions have taken place in the U.S. On this day we celebrate the intrinsic value of all human life. We also commend those who are working tirelessly to be the voice of life, to advocate for those who cannot speak for themselves.

# 2016 FINANCIAL UPDATE

Once again, our congregation has responded to the church's financial needs with a generous outpouring of gifts at year end.
