

Service of Worship Park Street Church | The Lord's Day, September 12, 2021

Instructions in this service booklet are indicated by the traditional symbol ¶, called a "pilcrow." The postures for prayer include kneeling, reflecting the many biblical invitations to kneel before God and even to fall upon our faces in his presence. Where hymns are listed, the name of the tune appears right-flush in small caps. Scripture lessons are taken from the English Standard Version.

Today at 11:00 the full Sanctuary Choir sings its first Sunday service since March 8, 2020, after eighteen months utilizing smaller groups. Park Street Church's choral tradition dates back to 1810, when the meetinghouse was completed and the original Park Street Singing Society was founded. Our choirs have generally sung from a loft in the rear balcony, which may be an unfamiliar practice to some. Traditional church architecture places the musicians out of the center of visual attention, often in the rear of a church. A primary reason for this is to allow the music itself to be the focus (most specifically the text and the truth it conveys) for the glory of God and the edification of his people, rather than drawing attention to the musicians as performers. An elevated position nearer the ceiling is acoustically advantageous, especially given that choral music, at its best, evokes the unity of worship between heaven and earth, calling to our imagination the song of angel choirs and of saints who from their labors rest, praising God on high as we join them in raising our song here below.
