The Fourth Sunday in Lent

***Welcome** to Park Street Church! We're glad you're worshipping with us today. If you're new, please take a look at the "NEW" section on the back cover for some ways to connect with us.*

***This service booklet** contains instructions (usually under the traditional symbol ¶, called a pilcrow) and explanations to aid the full participation of God's people in his worship. The People read **bold text** with a loud voice. Scripture lessons are from the English Standard Version.*

Purple is the traditional color of preparation and penitence, and is used during the seasons of Advent and Lent. Purple was historically the color of kings (the dye was extremely costly) so the color also emphasizes the royalty of Jesus (cf. John 19).

The composer of this morning's prelude was a friend of Park Street Church who composed a number of anthems specifically for the Sanctuary Choir as part of his decades-long collaboration with former Park Street Director of Music C. Thomas Brooks.

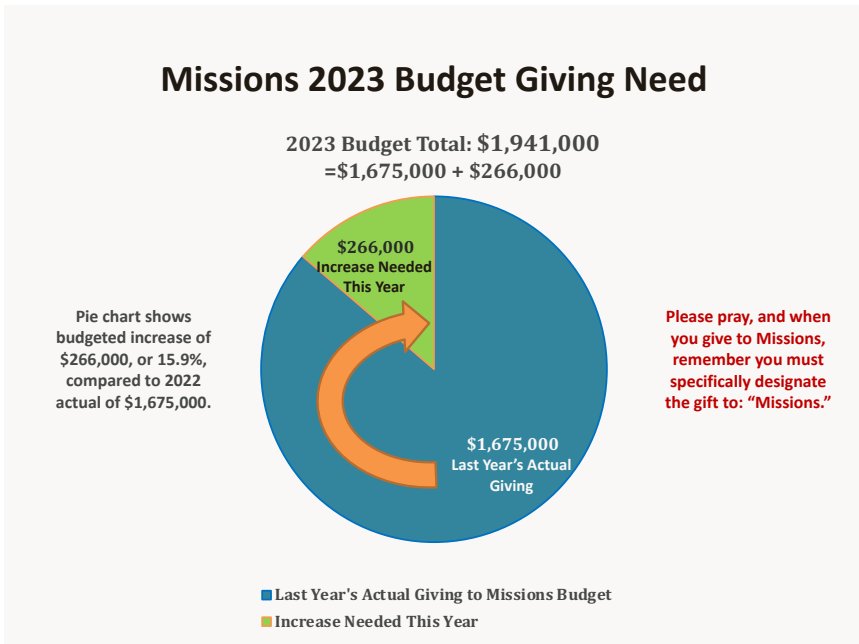

2023 MISSIONS BUDGET UPDATE

For those of you who missed the Annual Meeting, the approved 2023 Missions Budget anticipates a substantial increase of \$266K, or 15.9%, in congregational giving this year. The increase is due to long-planned, additional funding for PSC missionaries to various parts of Asia and the Middle East, and continuing outreach through City Engagement. The illustration below provides a summary of the need.

The 2023 Ministry & Operations Budget anticipates a more modest increase in congregational giving of \$141K, or 4.6%.
