Trinity Sunday

Welcome to Park Street Church! We're glad you're worshiping with us today. If you're new, please take a look at the "NEW" section on the back cover for some ways to connect with us.

This bulletin contains instructions (usually next to the pilcrow symbol ¶) and explanations meant to help us fully participate in our worship of God. The People read **bold text** with a loud voice. Scripture lessons are from the English Standard Version.

Today is Trinity Sunday, unique in the Christian calendar because it marks a biblical doctrine rather than a historical event. Trinitarian orthodoxy was formally elucidated by the Councils of Nicæa (AD 325) and Constantinople (AD 381), resulting in what we call the Nicene Creed. Park Street Church's founding in 1809 was motivated in large part by a desire to proclaim Trinitarian orthodoxy in the face of the Unitarian movement (which rejected the divinity of Christ).





2023 Missions Budget Update

At the Annual Meeting in February the congregation approved a "Big Ask" regarding the 2023 Missions Budget and anticipates a substantial increase of \$266K in giving, or 15.9%, for this year. This increase is due to long-planned, additional funding for PSC missionaries to various parts of Asia and the Middle East and continuing outreach through City Engagement.

Currently, year-to-date giving to Missions is equal to, but not greater than, last year. Please remember that gifts toward the Missions Budget must be specifically designated that way when you give electronically or noted in the memo line on your check or envelope. The illustration below provides a summary of the need.

The 2023 Ministry & Operations Budget anticipates a more modest increase in congregational giving of \$141K, or 4.6% and giving is currently at a pace to achieve that outcome.
