This bulletin contains instructions (usually next to the pilcrow symbol ¶) and explanations meant to help us fully participate in our worship of God. The People read **bold text** with a loud voice. Scripture lessons are from the English Standard Version.

Purple is the traditional color of preparation and penitence, and is used during the seasons of Advent and Lent. Purple was historically the color of kings (the dye was extremely costly) so the color also emphasizes the royalty of Jesus (cf. John 19).

¶ Note: The anthem was commissioned by the music ministry for today's service. Eastern Churches celebrate Lazarus' resurrection on the day before Palm Sunday in preparation for Holy Week and Easter. This mirrors Jesus spending the Sabbath before his own death with the man he had raised from the dead (John 12).

- Sat, Mar 30, 10 am 1 pm, to the Granary Room kitchen



The following announcement appeared in the bulletin on September 24, 1944:




As you fast during Lent, please consider this week's prayer request from World Relief:


Pray for World Relief Kenya as the country faces one of the most severe drought crises in modern African history, disproportionately impacting the historically marginalized region of Turkana.

The crisis is compounded by the fact that 80% of Kenya's population of 47 million live in rural areas, with most dependent on subsistence agriculture. Since the start of the drought, child malnutrition in Turkana has risen from 14% to 30%, while 60-80% of livestock have died from thirst and starvation.
