CALL TO WORSHIP

from Psalm 95

HYMN

At 11:00, the Choir sings stanza 3 alone; men sing stanza 4. At 8:30, the People sing all stanzas.

Following the brass fanfare, the organ alone plays the first line of the hymn, then the People sing.
