

SERVICE of WORSHIP Park Street Church | The Lord's Day, December 8, 2024 The Second Sunday of Advent **Welcome** to Park Street Church! We're glad you're worshiping with us today. If you're new, please take a look at the "**NEW**" section on the back cover for some ways to connect with us.

This bulletin contains instructions (usually next to the pilcrow symbol ¶) and explanations meant to help us fully participate in our worship of God. The People read **bold text** with a loud voice. Scripture lessons are from the English Standard Version

The word Advent is derived from the Latin Adventus, which means "arrival" or "coming," and is considered the beginning of the Church year. During these four weeks, we highlight the fact that we are an expectant people awaiting the return of our King, Jesus, to his world and his people. We look back upon the first Advent, Christ's coming in humility, and we remember the anticipation and expectation of God's people awaiting the coming of the Messiah. The season is marked by hopeful waiting and renewed repentance.

Purple is the traditional color of preparation and penitence, and is used during Advent and Lent. Purple was historically the color of kings (the dye was extremely costly) so the color also emphasizes the royalty of Christ Jesus (cf. John 19).



FINANCIAL UPDATE

In life and ministry, we walk by faith, trusting that God will provide. About \$4.6 million of our nearly \$5.6 million budget (including ministry & operations and missions) comes from regular giving from you, and nearly 25% of our church's giving is done in December!

Please consider giving generously, not just to help us close out the year, but to help us grow and continue to proclaim the Gospel boldly in 2025 to a broken world that desperately needs it.

Ministry & Operations:

Giving through December 1st was \$2 million, 6% below last year at this time. Year to date expenses are 4% below budget.

Missions:

Giving through December 1st was \$1.1 million, 14% below last year at this time. Year to date expenses are 13% below budget.
