Sunday after the Epiphany of our Lord

The Church celebrates the feast of Epiphany on January 6, directly after the season of Christmastide. Epiphany means "manifestation" or "revelation." In Christ, God has made himself known, not only to the Jews but to all peoples of the world. On Epiphany, the Western church points to the visit of the Magi, who were the first Gentiles to recognize Jesus as King, bowing down to worship him. In the Eastern church, the focus is on Christ's baptism, when all three persons of the Trinity testified that Jesus was the Son of God. Major themes of Epiphany are light, dawn, and Christ as the Morning Star.
