Note: Jesus spent the Sabbath before his death with Lazarus (Jn 12), whom he had already raised from the dead. Therefore on that day (Saturday before Palm Sunday) Eastern Churches celebrate Lazarus' resurrection in preparation for Holy Week and Easter.
