DID YOU KNOW...?

The theme for the Global Mission Conference 2025 is “Looking Back, Moving Forward,” and as we approach the conference, we would like to share some interesting facts each week from our two hundred-year history of missions at Park Street Church...

Dr. Robert Foster dedicated 60 years of medical care to the people of Zambia and war-torn Angola. In those years he founded three hospitals, started a nursing school, and served as a surgeon and medical director. He also served as the International Director of Africa Evangelical Fellowship (today’s SIM) and as such, drew many into overseas service through his stories, wise counsel, and testimony of God’s faithfulness. In 1988, he was named by World Vision International as its Missionary Stateman of the Year. In 2010, he was inducted into the Global Medical Missions Hall of Fame. Dr. Bob was best known for his love and care for the people he served. He and his wife Belva had seven children, five of whom served as SIM missionaries in Africa as well. One of his children, Stuart, and his wife Sindia, serve as Park Street missionaries in Mozambique. Stuart will be preaching next Sunday.
