

Service of Worship Park Street Church | The Lord's Day, November 30, 2025 The First Sunday of Advent

Welcome to Park Street Church! We're glad you're worshiping with us today. If you're new, please take a look at the "NEW" section on the back cover for some ways to connect with us.

This bulletin contains instructions (usually next to the pilcrow symbol ¶) and explanations meant to help us fully participate in our worship of God. The People read **bold text** with a loud voice. Scripture lessons are from the English Standard Version.

Today begins the four-week season of Advent, a word derived from the Latin Adventus, which means "arrival" or "coming," and is considered the beginning of the Church year. During these four weeks, we highlight the fact that we are an expectant people awaiting the return of our King, Jesus, to his world and his people. We look back upon the first Advent, Christ's coming in humility, and we remember the anticipation and expectation of God's people awaiting the Messiah. The season is marked by hopeful waiting and renewed repentance.

Purple is the traditional color of preparation and penitence, and is used during Advent and Lent. Purple was historically the color of kings (the dye was extremely costly) so the color also emphasizes the royalty of Christ Jesus (cf. John 19). The candles on the communion table are of unbleached beeswax.

Leader He has promised us an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading, and we are being guarded by God's power for a salvation ready to be revealed in the last time.


People Though we have not seen him, we love him.


Though we do not now see him, we believe in him.



THE POSTLUDE

¶ The People may sit or leave quietly during the postlude. Please be respectful of those listening to the music in the sanctuary or via the livestream. Today's postlude is a four-voice fugue played by the hands, using a theme taken from the traditional German hymn setting of the Magnificat; at the end, the pedals finally enter, playing the whole hymn melody in extended slow notes, while the fugue continues in the hands.






2025 YEAR-END BUDGET UPDATE

During the last weeks of the year our congregation's Ministry & Operations (M&O) and Missions giving is hoped to be \$850,000 for M&O and \$400,000 for Missions. While the remaining need may seem daunting, take heart; it is typical for 30% or more of the annual budgets to be funded by our gifts given in the last several weeks of the year.

Please pray, remembering that each of us should give sacrificially as we are able, and that God loves a cheerful giver. Remember that gifts intended for Missions must be specifically designated as such. The accompanying chart illustrates the situation.
