2026 SHORT TERM MISSIONS OPPORTUNITIES

Ivory Coast: Ministry of Trauma Healing for Young Women May 16–30, 2026

Ministers to girls who have been trafficked and who now are finding healing through life in a safe environment. Medical, counseling, nutritional professional skills are appreciated, as are practical skills in handicrafts, cottage industry, sports and exercise, English lessons, and Bible teaching.

Central Asia: Ministry to Young Professionals Jul 16–26, 2026

Meet young professionals and be a witness to the love of Christ through conversational English, public speaking practice, social events, etc. to build relationships and draw new people into community with believers.

Lewiston, Maine: Youth Trip - Ministry to Refugee & Immigrant Community Jul 26–31, 2026

Our team will be reaching out to a community of refugees and immigrants through Vacation Bible School, soccer, tutoring English and service projects.
